- 3) Candidates with expertise in quantitative or qualitative research methods.

Junior and senior scholars are encouraged to apply. ABD's are expected to have their dissertation approved no later than October 1<sup>st</sup> 2017.

The language of teaching at The Hebrew University of Jerusalem is Hebrew, though some courses are taught in English. New faculty members are expected to be able to teach in Hebrew within a few years after their arrival.

The deadline for applications is <u>October 5th, 2016</u>. Candidates selected by the Department of International Relations will have to compete with candidates from other departments in the Faculty of Social Sciences.
